**Question:** “Protecting civil privacy while maintaining national security”

The Special Conference 1,

*Observing* that the boundary between defending domestic interests and unwarranted invasion of privacy is becoming increasingly ambiguous,

*Noting with deep concern* the authoritarian advances of one-party states into citizen’s lives with social credit systems,

*Emphasizing* the importance of the mutual exclusivity between civil privacy and defending national interests,

*Urging* member states to take action in implementing measures against state-sponsored terrorism,

*Reaffirming* the United States of America’s intentions to promote liberty for all citizens in a rapidly modernising world,

1. Encourages all member states to implement nationwide organisations dedicated to tackling threats against national interests;
2. Introduces a revolutionary new algorithm developed by the United States Department of Defence used to identify potential suspects based on attributes including but not limited to:
  - a) physical traits such as:
    - i. body language,
    - ii. emotional responses,
    - ii. facial recognition (in conjunction with a criminal database),
    - iv. potential criminal history;
3. Approves the use of this algorithm for all member states to prevent further loss of life in acts of terrorism and ultimately enabling all member states to retain control of state sovereignty;
4. Invites member states to cooperate with American multinational corporations to increase the capabilities of their own national surveillance systems with incentives such as:
  - a) tax reductions,
  - b) exceptions from trade tariffs,

- c) VISA benefits for foreign citizens,
  - d) special discount codes for web privacy;
- 5. Calls for the creation of a new UN body to supervise the international criminal database in a effort to increase the outreach of the aforementioned algorithm;
- 6. Condemns the use of undemocratic espionage measures against citizens such as, but not limited to:
  - a) social credit systems,
  - b) illegal tapping,
  - c) fake news;
